Block 1: Fundamentals of Spanish

01 Greetings and Introductions.

Vocabulary and expressions to introduce yourself, greet, say goodbye, and ask for basic information.

02 Alphabet and Pronunciation.

Learning the sounds of Spanish, accentuation and intonation.

03 Numbers and Dates.

Numbers, days of the week, months, and how to tell the date and time.

04 Gender and Number of Nouns.

Basic rules about the gender (masculine/feminine) and number (singular/plural) of nouns.

05 Definite and Indefinite Articles.

Use of "el", "la", "los", "las" y "un", "una", "unos", "unas".

06 Describe People and Objects.

Basic adjectives to describe appearance, size, and color.

07 Personal Pronouns.

Use of subject personal pronouns (I, you, he, she, etc.).

08 Verb Ser and Estar.

Differences between "ser" and "estar" and basic uses in simple contexts.

09 Courtesy Phrases.

Expressions for polite situations: "please", "thank you", "excuse me", etc.

This block focuses on building a solid foundation of basic grammar, vocabulary and oral expression, necessary to function in simple situations.





**Block 2: Basic
Communication
in Spanish**

01 Verb Tener and Expressions with Tener.

Use of the verb "have" to express possession and other common expressions (to be hungry, to be cold).

02 Family and Personal Relationships.

Vocabulary about family members and relationships.

03 Daily Activities and Routine.

Vocabulary and verbs in the present tense to talk about daily routines.

04 Verb Like and Other Similar Verbs.

Use of "like", "love", "interest" and other preferred verbs.

05 Describe Places and Objects.

Vocabulary and expressions to describe spaces such as the house, the classroom or the city.

06 Ask and Give Directions.

How to ask and give basic directions in a city.

07 Colors and Description of Clothing.

Colors, types of clothing and expressions to describe what someone is wearing.

08 Direct and Indirect Object Pronouns.

Introduction to direct object pronouns (me, te, lo, la, etc.) and indirect object pronouns (me, te, le, etc.).

09 Verb Go and Immediate Future Expressions.

Use of the verb "go" to talk about immediate plans (go + infinitive).

This block delves into structures and vocabulary that help students handle basic conversations and describe their environment.





**Block 3:
Express
Yourself in
Everyday
Situations**

01 Making Purchases and Prices.

Vocabulary related to purchases, prices, and how to ask the cost of products.

02 Food and Drinks.

Vocabulary about food and drinks, and how to order in a restaurant or cafe.

03 Express Needs and Wants.

Using “need,” “want,” and “prefer” to express needs and desires.

04 Weather and Climate.

Expressions to talk about the climate and weather.

05 Health and the Body.

Vocabulary about body parts and how to describe basic symptoms and discomforts.

06 Leisure Activities and Hobbies.

Expressions to talk about free time activities and personal tastes.

07 Reflexive Verbs in Routines.

Use of reflexive verbs in daily actions (get up, bathe, go to bed, etc.).

08 Construction of Sentences in the Simple Future.


Introduction to the simple future tense to talk about long-term plans.

09 Prepositions of Place and Time.

Common prepositions to indicate place (in, on, next to) and time (before, after).

This block helps students navigate everyday situations and carry out activities in Spanish, such as shopping or ordering in a restaurant.

Communication Skills in

Contexts**

01 Make and Respond to Invitations.

Expressions to make invitations, accept or reject them politely.

02 Give Opinions and Make Suggestions.

How to express opinions and suggestions in conversations (I think, why not...?).

03 Describe Past Experiences (Preterite Perfect).

Introduction to the past perfect to describe recent experiences and events.

04 Basic Telephone Conversation.

Phrases and structure to carry out a telephone conversation in Spanish.

05 Request Information and Make Reservations.

How to request information or make reservations at a hotel or restaurant.

06 Basic Speech Connectors.

Use of connectors to link ideas (and, but, then, because, also).

07 Write Messages and Emails.

Structure and vocabulary to write formal and informal messages.

08 Talk about Plans and Projects.

Expressions to talk about projects, goals and future plans.

09 Review and Practical Conversation.

Conversational practice sessions, integrating all the knowledge acquired.

This block focuses on skills to maintain a more fluid conversation in both formal and informal contexts.
